Getting What God Has to Say

On Sunday mornings, Pastor Mike teaches "The Greatest Story" at 9:30 in the sanctuary.

The Greatest Story is a sixteen week Bible overview class, covering the entire Bible from Genesis to Revelation as it introduces key people, places, and events in an easy-to-understand story.

Participants are invited to explore where they fit in the greatest story and how the greatest story fits in their lives. If you are unable to make each session, do not worry about it. You will still be enjoy and benefit from this terrific class.

About the Bible Translation Risen Lord Uses

In worship and Bible study, Risen Lord uses the Bible translation called the New Revised Standard Version. It was released in 1989, and is an update of the Revised Standard Version (RSV). It modernizes and simplifies the language of the RSV.

This Bible translation is the most accurate and literal translation available to us today. It is, as much as is possible, a word for word translation from the original Hebrew and Greek of the Bible. It is even more literal than the New International Version.

What makes it such a reliable translation is that it benefits from the most recently discovered Biblical manuscripts and scholarship and it changes archaic English words (such as "thee" and "thou"), and the makes good use

of gender-inclusive language.

Gender-inclusive language does represent a change from the traditional translations, however, in many cases, the original language, Koine Greek, is gender ambiguous. For example, *adelphoi*, can be translated as either "brothers" or "brothers and sisters."

While the NRSV is the preferred translation for worship and study, there are many other translations at the church recommended for daily reading or devotion: The New Living Bible, The Message, The Good News Bible, The New Jerusalem Bible, and the Contemporary English Version.

These are often easier to read than a direct word for word translation. Whichever one you choose, make sure you use it..

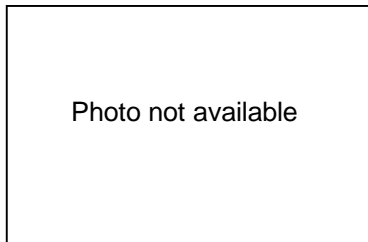

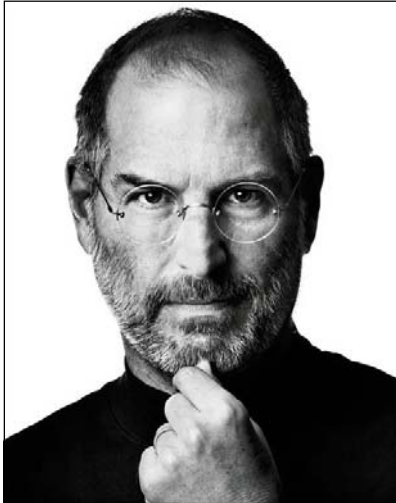

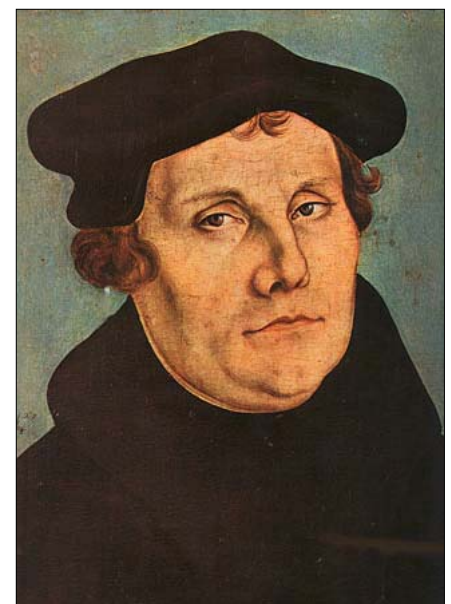

Two major motion picture films have been made about the life of Martin Luther. Most recently, in 2003 Joseph Fiennes (of Shakespeare in Love) starred in the role of the movie *Luther*.

The other, *Martin Luther*, was produced in 1955 to rave reviews and major box office success. This year, Risen Lord Lutheran Heritage month will feature the classic film

Martin Luther .

The National Board of Review named the film the fourth best of 1953. It was nominated for two Academy Awards , for Best Cinematography (Black-and-White) and Art Direction/Set Decoration. The music was composed by Mark Lothar and performed by the Munich Philharmonic Orchestra. It was filmed in West Germany from studios in Wiesbaden.

In parts of Cambodia and around the world, your steps in the CROP Hunger Walk can turn into nutritious, green leafy vegetables.

"I now have vegetables for eating and don't have to buy them from the market or neighbors, so I can save a bit of money,"

says Eam Ean, a widow who is supporting her four children and an elderly mother. Ean's is one of 90 families in Preah Vihear Province who received seeds for planting gardens through Church World Service.

Through CWS, the families also learned to place fences around their gardens to prevent animals from eating their crops. And they are weeding and watering their gardens regularly. The result: More food for everyone.

Some other ways your small steps can make a big difference:

\$25 can provide a farm family with everything they need to make succulent, nutritious honey -- hives, training, equipment.

\$50 can provide 400 lbs. of much-needed food for a local church-run food pantry, or seeds and tools for three families.

The walk is a two mile trek so wear comfortable walking shoes and a bring bottle of water. Roller blades, bikes, skateboards, and scooters are discouraged to assure greater safety for the walkers.

ARMS WIDE OPEN

The Case for the Campaign

Risen Lord Lutheran Church offered its first worship service in January 26, 1996 at the Center Grove High School cafeteria with arms open wide in welcome. The halls of the school echoed with the song "Come Just as You Are." The preacher preached. Donuts and coffee were served. People came. Growth happened. Challenges were met and corners were turned.

As a result, Risen Lord was chartered in the twelfth month, organized in the fifteenth, and financially self-supporting in the twenty-fourth.

ARMS WIDE OPEN

We kept inviting people to come as they were, embracing them with warmth and love. In the third year, land was bought. Worship services were added, children baptized, donuts and coffee served. Growth continued. Other challenges were met and more corners turned. As a result, Risen Lord designed and built with volunteer labor a beautiful church building, becoming a land-

mark on the South Side of Indianapolis. **ARMS WIDE OPEN.**

Over the past eight years since we moved into the building Risen Lord's membership has more than doubled while worship attendance has steadily increased. With this kind of growth new challenges arise.

After almost four years of deep thought and prayer, we now realize that we do not have enough room for all the people God is sending us. Membership continues to increase but our space is limiting.

ARMS WIDE OPEN?

There is a spiritual hunger in our community and people are drawn to Risen Lord to be fed and nourished. In fact, they love it so much that they join longing to be a part of this amazing community of faith. But, people don't love feeling cramped and crowded, which is what is happening on Sunday morning.

We simply don't have enough room. The loving community we started in 1996 singing "Come Just as You Are" has grown beyond the bounds of our current space. We are simply unable to accommodate all the loving hearts

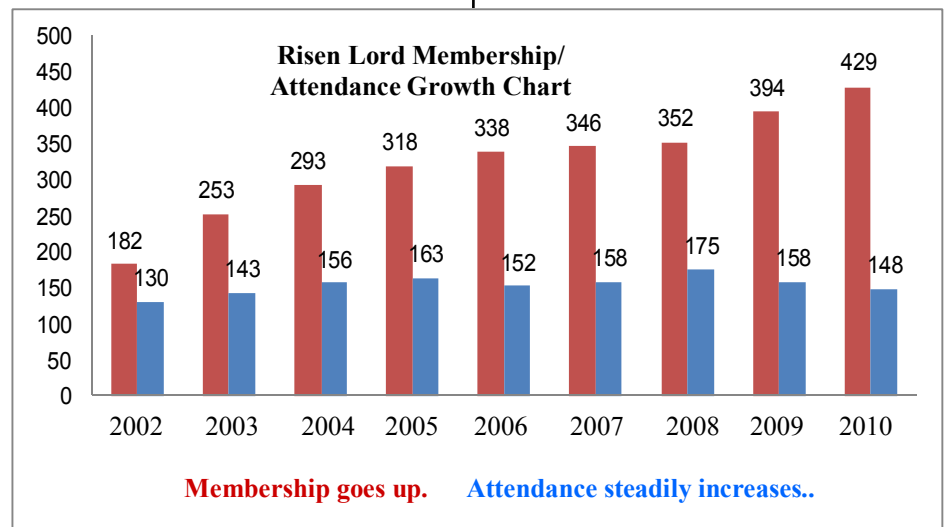
that God continues to gather among us.

ARMS WIDE OPEN?

That means we need to make some critical decisions about our worship and facility space. How can we best address our space issues, and our current indebtedness, to allow us to keep our arms wide open and receive unconditionally all those that come into our embrace?

This summer the congregation approved the hiring of Kairos and Associates to help us conduct a debt reduction campaign. As we move forward with this we want to first do some listening and assessing of what we believe will have the greatest impact in addressing our most urgent needs.

We need your input to help in planning our next steps. We want to touch base with each other. We are turning to our consultant, Jeff Kjellberg, to do this. Jeff will be conducting a listening campaign at Risen Lord to hear each of you speak your heart and mind as you look to Risen Lord's future. He is interested in hearing how you envision us keeping our **ARMS WIDE OPEN!**
